WHO DECIDES WHERE THE MONEY GOES?



There are many volunteers who contribute to the success of the SCCF, but none are more critical than the SC members who serve on the SCCF Grants Committee. Each year, this group is charged with the weighty responsibility of fulfilling the SCCF mission by selecting the agencies that will receive the monetary Grant Awards made possible by your generous donations.

The Committee takes this responsibility very seriously and the task has become increasingly difficult as the years go by. In 2008 there were 15 applicants, while last year applications were submitted by 32 organizations. How do they select the most deserving? The answer is by having a first-class Online Application and Selection Process.



To qualify for a SCCF Grant, prospective organizations must successfully complete the online screening process and grant application. Committee members read all of the applications and individually rank each application as follows: #1 - Does not fit our mission, #2 - Discuss and support at some level or #3 - Consistent with the SCCF mission and should receive the full award requested.

The entire Committee meets in mid February and each member submits his/her recommendations. All new applicants receive a site visit by two or three committee members. Community Foundation for Southern Arizona has recognized the SCCF as the only foundation in Tucson that visits all programs requesting Grant

Awards. Repeat applicants must submit a follow up report as part of the application and may be visited again or receive a personal call.

In March, the most important and eventful meetings occur. Rankings are revised based on new information and resubmitted. Then the fun begins -- because the members don't always agree! After numerous discussions, debates, tears and finally agreement, the committee votes on the final amount of each Award. When making monetary decisions several factors are considered, for example: how many youth will benefit, the program's financially stability, the program's longevity, whether results are measureable. When grant

recipients and their Awards have been agreed upon, the Committee celebrates with a toast to each other and to SCCF. This is a tradition that started with the first round of Grant Awards in 2008. They don't hold hands and sing Kum Bi Ya....but it has been considered! Final reports are completed and presented to the SCCF Board of Directors for its approval.

The secret ingredient to the success of the SCCF is The Stone Canyon Community! Without your generosity and commitment to making education, graduation and eventually, self sustainability possible for the youth of the Tucson metro area, none of the Grants Committee's efforts could come to fruition. Thank you so much!

"Our small community of Stone Canyon has been very generous in supporting SCCF's quest for funds, and with the membership growing SCCF needs to try even harder to let everyone know the foundation's mission and educate those who are not familiar with it".


A warm welcome is extended to the new BOD members: Eileen Antonucci, Diane Dowd, Dan Regis and Rod Rupp. We look forward to working with you!

Sources of SCCF Funds


In addition to our two fundraisers, the sources of SCCF funds included matching funds from the Diamond Family Fund and the generous Annual Fund Donations made by individual SC members.
