In the past year, the Stone Canyon Club has seen many changes and a tremendous growth in membership. Likewise, the Stone Canyon Community Foundation also must evolve and grow. After a review of the effectiveness of past fundraising efforts, a new strategy was developed and communicated to the members in April 2022.

Here's a brief review:

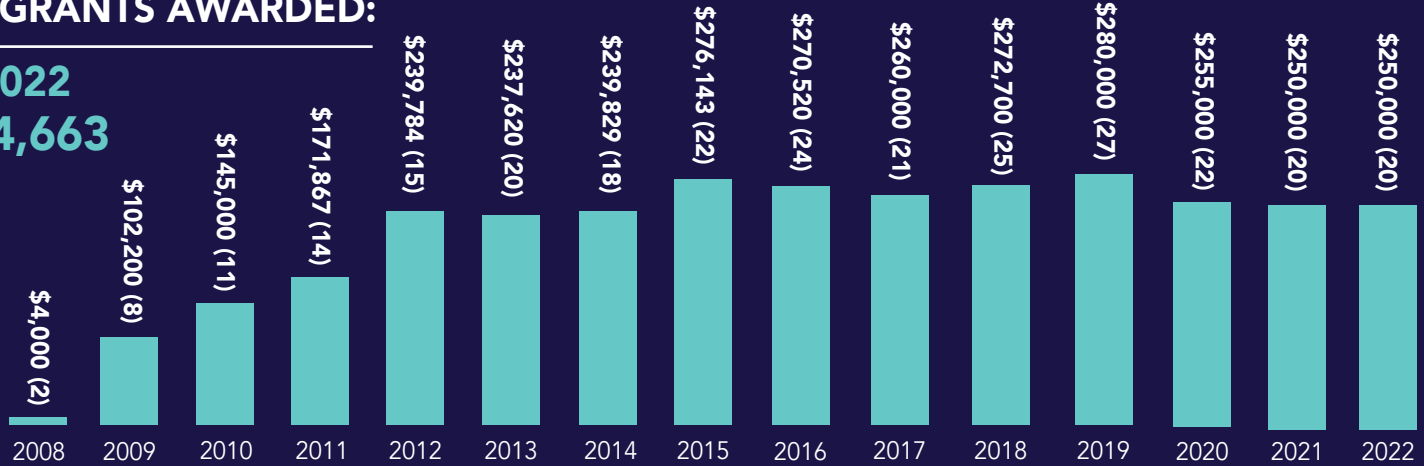
- **Conduct only one fundraiser annually** - ask for financial support only during the Annual Appeal running October through December
- **Increase awareness of SCCF's Mission** - sponsor 2-3 entertaining or educational "donor appreciation events" per year that will be free of charge to Stone Canyon members
- **Enhance member knowledge of the impact of their donations** - host onsite grantee presentations and arrange member visits to the grantee agencies
- **Recognize SCCF'S generous donors** – host a donor appreciation event celebrating SCCF's 15 years of giving
- **Pursue support from local businesses** - explore hosting a golf tournament for local business sponsors
- **Continue SCCF'S rigorous member – driven grant review and selection process**

Although our approach to fundraising has changed, SCCF's mission remains the same – positively impacting the development of youth-in-need.

SCCF's 2021 highlights include our successful Annual Appeal and Fall Event. Between the two fundraising efforts, we exceeded our 2021 goal of **\$250,000**.



SCCF's "Spirit of Giving" drive in December, and the "Sax on the Lawn" event in March, helped to collect car loads of much needed basic hygiene supplies for Reunion House Shelter. Reunion House is a shelter for homeless youth and youth in crisis between ages 12-17.

SCCF offered an education experience in February, with an encore presentation from Matt Goode, University of Arizona Research Scientist & Wildlife Conservationist. Matt shared his knowledge of Stone Canyon's snake (21 species) and lizard population, as well as safety measures while living in the desert.

We are grateful to you, our Stone Canyon members, who graciously donated items and financial support in 2021. Your financial donations allowed SCCF to continue funding our average of \$250,000 in annual grants.

SCCF LEGACY FUND

The SCCF Legacy Fund's purpose is to ensure an alternative source of funding to make annual grants more predictable and stable. Creating a steady source of income, regardless of economic conditions, to protect our ability to continue issuing grants supporting critical local non-profit agencies.

The SCCF Legacy Fund was developed in partnership with the Community Foundation for Southern Arizona (CFSA). CFSA has the infrastructure to accept current or estate gifts on behalf of the SCCF. SCCF's intention is to grow the Fund over time. Our goal for our Legacy Fund is to attain \$5 million in pledges over a 10-year period. Impressively, the SCCF Legacy Fund has already received over \$3 million in pledges.
