Peter Breslin, Phd
Research Affiliate, Desert Lab
The University of Arizona

Peter has been researching saguaros for 20 years and shared what he's learned by managing the "Future of the Saguaro Research Project" located at the Desert Laboratory on Tumamoc Hill. His research follows 4,000 saguaros. Peter and his team collect data for each saguaro, such as height of main stem, number of arms, condition, local ground and canopy cover and mortality. His team has been working to better understand the impact of buffelgrass on saguaro populations. Peter applauded Stone Canyon members for continuing to plant new saguaros and rid the area of buffelgrass.
